At The West Yorkshire and Harrogate Excellence Centre, we have had a couple of busy months. 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Core Offer:

Support Staff Workforce Development Funding:

Last year Health Education England (HEE) asked the West Yorkshire and Harrogate Excellence Centre to manage the distribution of the annual budget, the purpose of which is to support training and development interventions for the healthcare support staff workforce. Details of the budget were released at the end of July and applications for the funding were invited from any health and social care organisations responsible for delivering services as part of the West Yorkshire and Harrogate Integrated Care System with the closing date for applications 23rd August.

13 proposals have been received from all six localities, and have been shared with identified place based representatives prior to final review by a WYHEC panel. Comments from representatives will be part of the assessment process and allocation decisions will be confirmed by 20th September.

It is hoped that the process will support system working and locality priorities, thus providing greater benefit to the health and care system. All successful proposals will be required to outline an evaluation plan using the LeaDER framework to evidence impact so as to provide a business case for continuation of funding in future years.

Local Workforce Action Board:

West Yorkshire and Harrogate have been successful in securing funding from the LWAB (Local Workforce Action Board) to develop a one year workforce development hub project aimed at developing person centered communication skills for the health and social care workforce. A steering group is currently being set up and further information will follow.


Support Staff Conference:


This Hub is the first of its kind for the region and remains a work in progress. We have focused on adding information that enlightens people interested in a future career in health and care.

Work Experience and Employabilty

We have examined current Health and Care work experience models and have pulled together a framework for producing a work experience tool kit to increase uptake and address current barriers.

We will publish this Tool Kit on our website by October 2019.

We are also planning an event aimed at engaging with a minimum of 15 organisations across West Yorkshire and Harrogate to equip them to deliver the Career Ambassador role within their service to promote Careers in Health & Care.

We have also mapped the employability programmes across the region and started to develop metrics to measure the impact of our programmes in getting people into work.

Apprenticeships:

What we have done:

Since our last newsletter we have been moving on with our project to maximise the usage of the apprenticeship levy across West Yorkshire and Harrogate, and we have had a number of successes.

In just over two months over 80 potential apprentices have come through to the team from across the health and social care sector. We predict that, if all of these apprentices come online, that we will have spent £520,000 of the available transfer pot. We have also worked to increase awareness of our offer from across the region by promoting it via our networks and promoting our website.

Next Steps:

We want to build on these successes and get over 100 new apprentices moving through the pathway by the end of the year. We will continue to educate and increase knowledge around apprenticeships across our region, which we will do through engagement with training providers and employers. We will also host Apprenticeship Roadshows in each region-please see our Twitter feed and Website for details of these when they become available. The team will also continue to work with key stakeholders to promote best practice in employing apprentices and advertise apprenticeship standard across our system.

How to access the offer:

The WYHEC apprenticeship offer to health and social care is very simple. Organisations that are interested in employing an apprentice, or feel that they have a skills gap in the organisation can contact the Project Manager, Callum Bennett, or the Project Support Officer, Heather Nicholson, and we will assess and assist in identifying if the levy transfer can be supported. The team will also continue to work with key stakeholders to promote best practice in employing apprentices and advertise apprenticeship standard across our system.

We are able to advise on what apprenticeship training programmes are available, whether the programmes available fit the need of the organisation and what infrastructure will be required to host the apprentice. The team will look to identify training providers on behalf of the prospective employer, and put the employer in touch with a named contact from this provider. Finally we can support the employer to get onto the Digital Apprenticeship Service and transfer funds from a levy paying organisation the employing organisations to pay for the training.

Health Education England (HEE) has confirmed that it will invest £2 million in 2019/20 to boost the learning disability workforce with an extra 230 registered nurses and 150 trainee nursing associates.

- A 2 Year registered nurse apprenticeship for nursing associates who wish to become learning disability nurses.
- A new Post-Graduate Learning Disability Apprenticeship
- A new Undergraduate Learning Disability Apprenticeship.
- Additional money for investment in a targeted awareness campaign.

The first citywide careers and recruitment event for health and care took place on 15 May.

It proved to be a great success with more than 700 vacancies promoted by over 30 employers – and almost 400 people through the doors!

Employers offered a variety of opportunities for employment, apprenticeships, volunteering and work experience and received nearly 1,000 enquiries as a result of the event. In just one week.

There were 72 applications for one apprenticeship and one role at Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust.

There was help with applications or advice to help people find the right role for their next career move.

The newly appointed Leeds health and care ambassadors were also available on the evening to talk about their many roles in health and care.


